Q: I canceled my membership but I'm still getting "payment failed" renewal emails. Why?

A: This typically means your membership is in a "past due" or "grace period" status rather than fully canceled. Call +1(888)400-4972 and ask the agent to confirm that your membership shows as "Terminated" – not "Suspended" or "Past Due."
